Hello, and welcome to the latest edition of Inspire's monthly Family Matters newsletter for the families and loved ones of the people we support.



I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued patience, cooperation and support over the past twelve months - 2021 has undoubtedly been a year of great challenges and, I have no doubt some frustrations, but as I look back with just a few days of the year remaining I am incredibly proud of how everyone associated with Inspire - the people we support, our staff and you, the families - have coped and got through the difficult times. Here's to 2022 being a better year for everyone.

As we highlighted in last month's newsletter, from the start of December our Support Workers have been receiving the new rate of pay of £10.12 an hour and I am pleased to share with you that Inspire's Board has also agreed to an extra £300 (pro rata) Winter Bonus payment for all staff in recognition of their continued commitment to the people we support. We hope that these financial incentives will aid staff retention and help us to address the significant staffing challenge that we, and indeed the wider social care sector, is currently experiencing.

I also wanted to share with you that I have made the difficult decision to take some time out of the business until early 2022 to deal with my own family issue, Sharon Catchpole, Director of People, will be deputising for me in my absence, supported by the wider Leadership Team and Inspire's Board, and I know that the organisation is in safe hands. ## As you will all be aware by now Scotland's First Minister,

Nicola Sturgeon, announced a number of new measures last week which aim to combat the rapid transmission of the Omicron strain of Covid-19 across the country. Guidance has been updated that reduces social interaction at home

and in indoor public places in the run up to and after Christmas to a maximum of three households at any time, with people encouraged to take a lateral flow test before mixing with any other households. There are no limits on the size of household gatherings on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day or Boxing Day but people are asked to take extra precautions including ensuring visitors undertake LFD tests, making sure indoor spaces are well ventilated, encouraging regular hand washing etc. The full update can be read <u>here</u>.

We know that many families will now have all their plans in place for the festive period

- including having their loved ones returning to the family home for a spell. We are delighted that these family get-togethers are able to happen this year but would ask you to please ensure that you comply with this new advice over the festive season. Whilst it is only guidance at this stage the Scottish Government have been at pains to point out that it is 'not optional" and is designed to keep everyone safe. In relation to visiting at Inspire's services over the festive season, again we understand

how important it is that the people we support and their families can celebrate together

and are doing all that we can to work with you to ensure meaningful contact in the coming weeks within the guidance set-out by the Scottish Government. As of last weekend this guidance now includes no more than two additional households visiting someone we support at a time - and all visitors returning a negative lateral flow test prior to their meeting. Further information can be found here. Whilst Inspire will be working to do our utmost to support all visiting arrangements over the festive period, should we have any concerns regarding positive cases of COVID-19 we


George from Peterhead went to see Daniel O'Donnell live in concert. He had a great time!












Dave from Chattan Place went to Dunnotar Woods and found a fairy trail. He really enjoyed it and wanted to let others know about it.




Elgin enjoyed making Christmas decorations at Dreamtime - a class she attends on a Tuesday and Friday.
