Hello, and welcome to the latest edition of Inspire's monthly Family Matters newsletter for the families and loved ones of the people we support.



I am delighted to have returned to the business in earnest this month having had some time away to attend to a family health matter in the early part of the year. I am looking forward to getting out and about to visit our services and speak to staff on a face-to-face basis over the coming months, as well as attending future Family Engagement sessions.

We were pleased this month to be able to announce details of pay increases for all Inspire staff, with immediate effect, following consultation with our Board, and in line with the commitment from the Scottish Government to provide vital extra funding to the health and social care sector to ensure that frontline support staff are paid a minimum of £10.50 per hour. In line with previous years we will be paying an additional uplift of 1%, meaning that the rate of pay for contracted, front-line Inspire support workers has gone up from £10.12 per hour to £10.61 per hour. All of our other operational and business support staff not impacted by the £10.50 related increases have also seen their salaries increased by £1,000 per annum (pro-rata).


We have made this decision, prior to any definitive commitment from our funders, to go some way towards recognising the continued loyalty our staff have all shown the organisation over the past year and for the huge, positive contribution they all continue to make to the lives of the people we support - your loved ones.



Positive Care Inspectorate Reports For Two Inspire Services

We are delighted to be able to share some positive news following Care Inspectorate inspections of two of our services recently.

Both our Sycamore Way service, in Banchory, and Community Living Project (CLP) service supporting people in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire and Moray, received grades of 5 - Very Good - for the Key Questions: How well do we support people's wellbeing? and How good is our care and support during the Covid-19 pandemic?



Both inspection reports praise staff's knowledge of infection prevention and control (IPC) and use of PPE and highlight their enabling attitudes. There is also acknowledgement of opportunities for people to be involved in activities - both through Inspire and within the local community - being maximised.

The Aberdeen City Health & Social Care Partnership has awarded us more than £5,000

through the Health Improvement Fund to cover the costs of our monthly Aberdeen Supper Club for the next twelve months, while the Aberdeen Student Show has confirmed we will receive a Silver Grant Award (around £2,500) from the proceeds of their performances in April.
