PEOPLE WE SUPPORT HOLIDAYS IN 2023

We wanted to officially update you in relation to the subject of people we support holidays facilitated by Inspire staff in 2023.

There has been a great deal of work done to try and find a positive solution to this issue as we recognise how beneficial holidays and day trips can be for the people we support. The proposed way forward for 2023 was discussed with those we support at our Positive People Improvement Council in February and has now been finalised and agreed.

In some instances, facilitating holidays with Inspire staff may still be of significant challenge and there may be barriers to progressing but we are committed to do our best with the resources available to us to support holidays of no more than 5 days within the UK for the people we support who wish to take a break this year.

All proposed holidays with Inspire staff must be assessed and approved by the relevant Support Manager and then signed off by a Regional Manager before anything is booked or paid for.

We hope that this is welcome news for the people we support - and indeed for you - and look forward to hearing of holiday plans as the year progresses. If you have any queries in relation to this matter then please discuss these with the Manager of your service in the first instance.

POSITIVE CARE INSPECTORATE REPORTS FOR INSPIRE SERVICES

We are delighted to be able to share some positive news following Care Inspectorate inspections of three of our services recently.

Our Eden Drive service, in Peterhead, Inspire Angus service and Peterhead Housing Support service all received grades of 5 - Very Good - for the Key Questions: How well do we support people's wellbeing? and How good is our leadership?

Some positive quotes from the Eden Drive report included:

"People's days were filled with what they wanted to do; working, pursuing activities and simply enjoying the house and socialising."

"The leadership and quality assurance in the home was at a very good level. There was a drive for continuous improvement through innovation."

The Peterhead Housing Support report said:

"People had exceptionally detailed personal plans which enabled staff to support people's health and wellbeing. Plans were tailored to the individual's needs and wishes and incorporated tools, such as communication and sensory dictionaries."

"People had formed positive relationships with their key workers who supported them to talk about what was important to them and ensured their views were at the centre of decisions."

Whilst the Inspire Angus report highlighted:

"People were safe and protected because leaders were proactive in ensuring that systems and resources were in place to support infection prevention and control and are responsive to potential and actual outbreaks of infection."

"We observed warm and supportive relationships. Staff were respectful and encouraged people to express their views."

Well done to all involved at the three services for these deserved positive reports - what a great start to 2023.

We are pleased to be able to share positive funding news this month following three grant awards that have been made recently.


A grant of £2,000 has been made by the Meikle Foundation and a grant of £500 has been awarded by the Andrew Paton Charitable Trust.

We are also delighted to have been successful with a recent application to the Aberdeen Student Show fund for 2023.

Inspire has been chosen as a Silver charity for the event which means that we will receive 2.5% of the proceeds from the show this year - around £2,500 based on previous year's fundraising totals.




We had a visit from the Bob's Buddies Owls recently. Everyone enjoyed learning more about the Owls and getting to hold them.
